

Weedon Walkies Field Rules

Updated March 2025

Upon booking, you accept these terms and conditions, and the customer booking is responsible for making all members of the party they visit with aware of the rules.

Field Rules:

- You must keep a good eye on your dog(s) and ensure that they do not cause any damage to the field, its property and clean up any dog waste. Dogs should not be left unattended at any time. You should accompany your dog(s) at all times, so that you are aware of what your pet is doing and that they are safe and complying to these terms and conditions.
- All poo should be bagged and placed in the green dog bin provided.
- Dog must be in good health and not showing any signs of illness to protect all dogs who use the field. If there are any signs of ill health, including a cough or gastrointestinal symptoms, then you should move your booking online or contact us if it is too close to the visit to move online.
- You agree that you use the field at your own risk and may not hold the owners of Weedon Walkies responsible for any injury or damage to yourself, your dogs or your property arising from your use of the field.
- The field is part of a working farm and subject to weather conditions, so will in parts be unlevel and muddy. The visitor is advised to wear sensible and appropriate footwear to suit the grounds and conditions.
- Visitors should enjoy the field for 55 minutes and ensure their dog is loaded up within that time, so that they can vacate the field before the next visitors.
- You must not at any time park on any grassed area. Parking of vehicles is only permitted in the gravel car park.
- You must not climb on any gates, fences or posts at any time. If any injuries are caused by doing so, the field owners are not held responsible.
- Visitors should not arrive more than five minutes early for their booking to avoid overlap with the previous visitors. Do not get any dogs out of your vehicle while the previous visitor is still in the field and their dogs are out.
- Do not allow your dog(s) to dig in any part of the venue, at any time. If they do attempt to dig stop them immediately as holes caused by your dog could pose a risk to

other users. If your dog(s) dig(s) please attempt to fill the hole. If your dog(s) causes significant damage, please inform Weedon Walkies immediately to enable repair.

- The boundary and security of the field is checked on a daily basis, however the Client is advised to check that they are satisfied with the height, safety and condition of the fencing and to inform Weedon Walkies owners on the phone numbers on the welcome sign of any discrepancies.
- Visitors are not permitted to walk anywhere around the outside of the dog field and in the surrounding farmland
- Visitors should bear in mind that there are no lights at the field and so be sure that the daylight is sufficient for their booking
- Visitors should not smoke on site or consume any foods that are poisonous to dogs on the premises.

Rules specific to Dogs registered under the Dangerous Dogs Act (including XL bullies).

- Owners must only visit the field with their dog if they have a valid Certificate of Exemption and valid third-party public liability insurance for banned breeds of dogs. **Copies of these documents MUST be emailed to info@weedonwalkies.com before your booking.** No dogs should visit the field without sending these documents. It will invalidate insurance cover.
- The dog handler ratio is 1:1 with their handler at all times unless with other dogs from the same household
- Only dogs from one household can use the exercise field at any one time
- Dogs must be muzzled in cars travelling in public spaces and the dog must keep the muzzle on until they are within the boundary of the secure field and the gate is locked behind them using the digital padlock. This can be unlocked with the same code as your access code upon departure.
- The dog is put back on a lead and muzzled before opening the gate to leave the exercise field
- All other field rules apply, such as not arriving early for your time slot and ensuring you leave 5 minutes before the next time slot to avoid overlap with other visitors.
